DiReCTIONS

If you have never made a lapbook, then you may want to google for a how-to video. However, they are very simple! Each student will need a file folder. They will take the right side and fold it in to the center. Then they will do they same with the left side.

Each student will need a copy of the five pages of flap books and foldables.

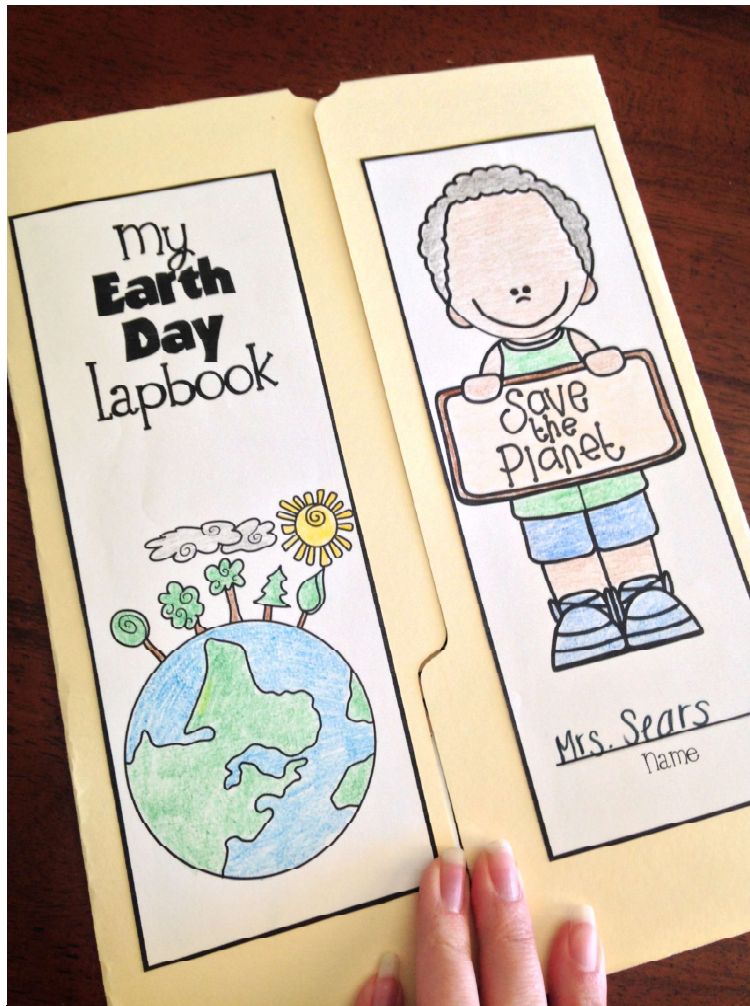
The foldables are simple to make. Just cut along the SOLID lines and fold along the DASHED lines. Use the pictures on the following pages as a guide.

You can use the PowerPoint to help teach about Earth Day. Books and videos can be added as well.

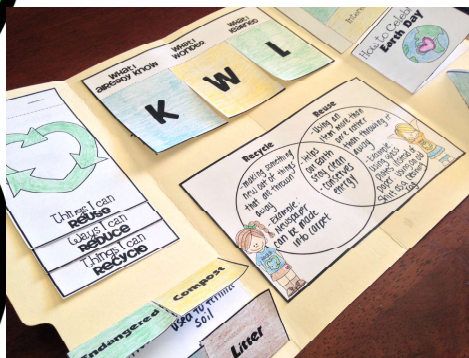
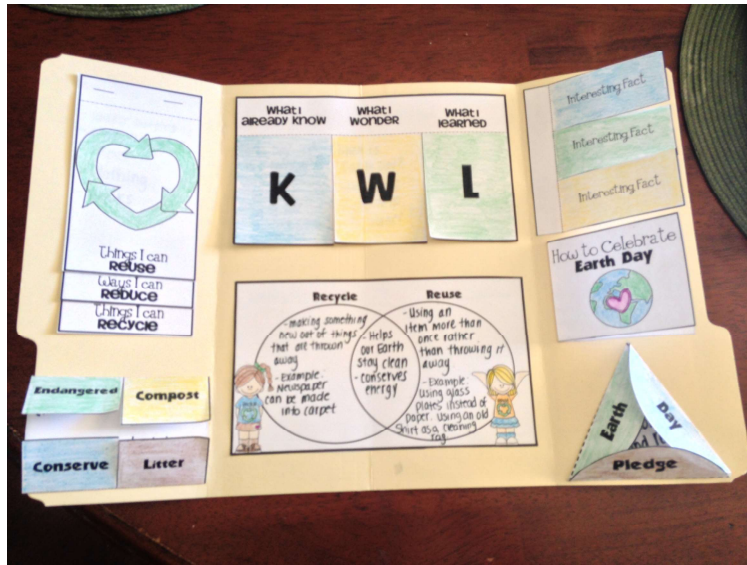
This project can be completed in one day or over the course of several days. Whatever works for your class!

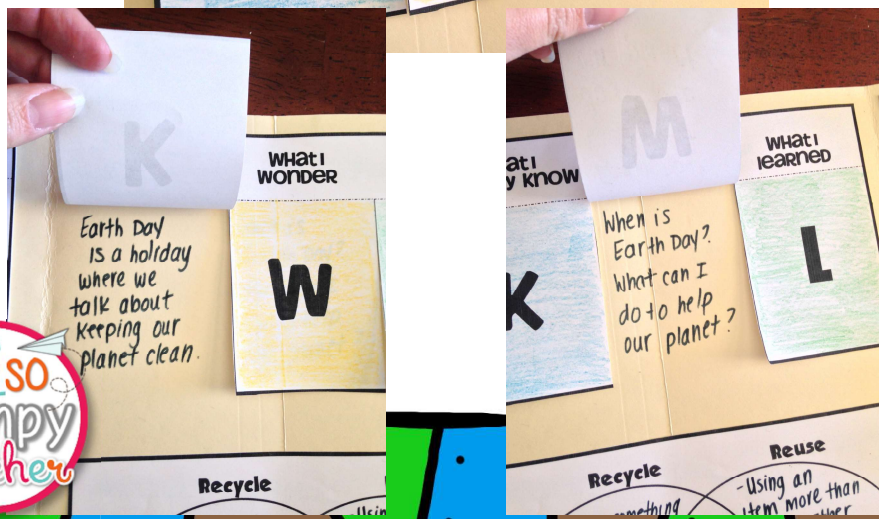
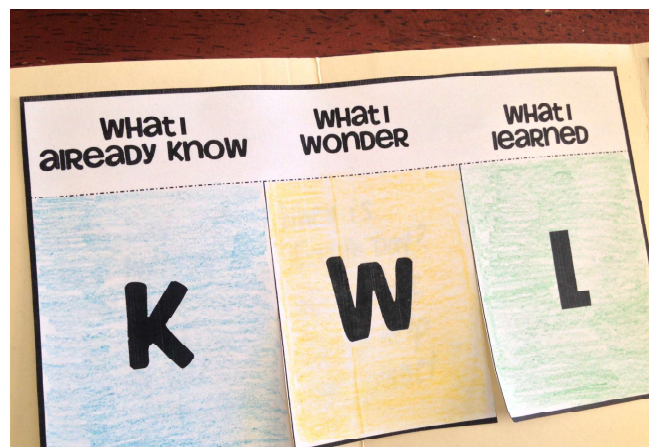


INSIDE THE BOOK



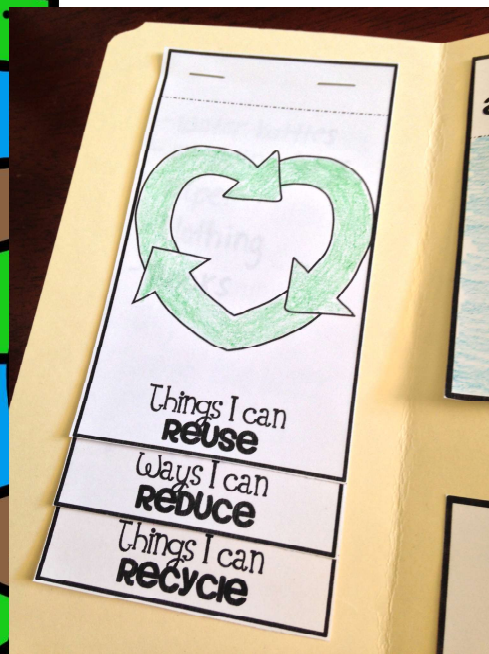
KWL FLIP BOOK

Have your students fill out what they already know and what they wonder or want to learn about. This should be done before you teach. After you teach about Earth Day, have students go back and write about what they learned.

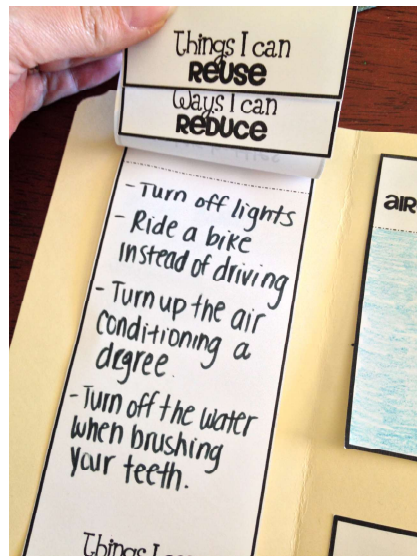


REUSE-REDUCE-RECYCLE BOOK

REUSE-REDUCE-RECYCLE BOOK

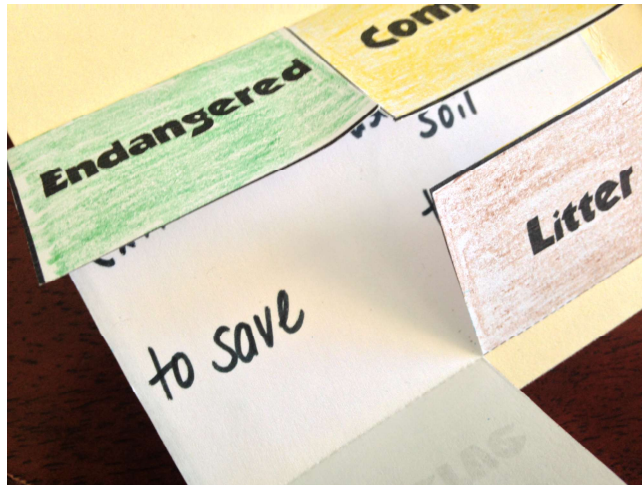


VOCABULARY BOOK

As you discuss Earth Day, you may want to teach a few new vocabulary words.

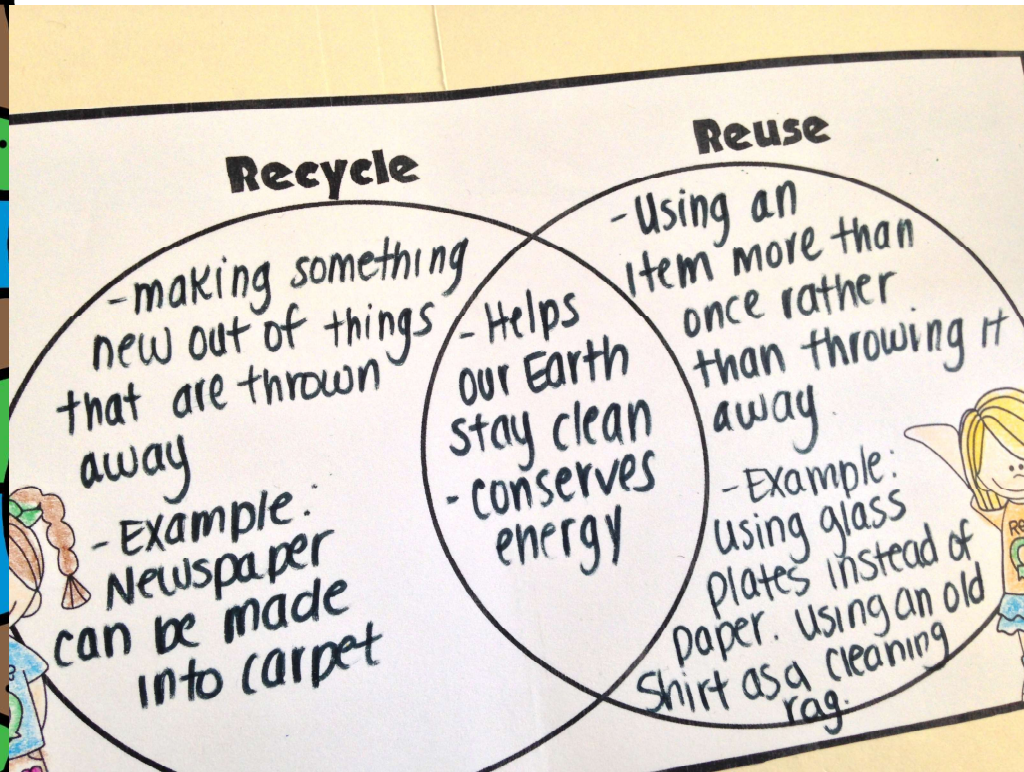


VOCABULARY BOOK



VENN DIAGRAM

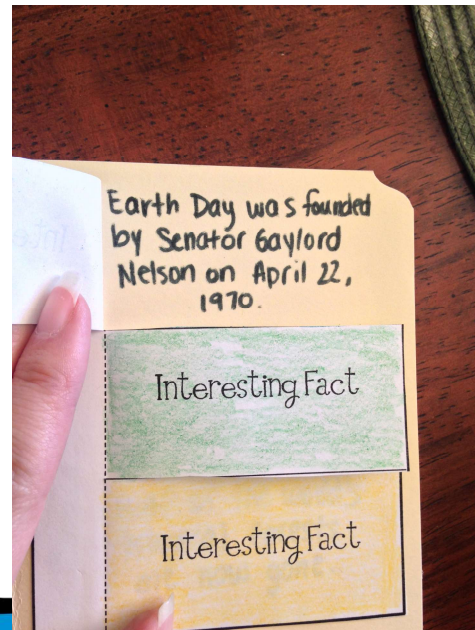
Have students compare recycling and reusing.

Earth Day was founded by Senator Gaylord Nelson on April 22, 1970.

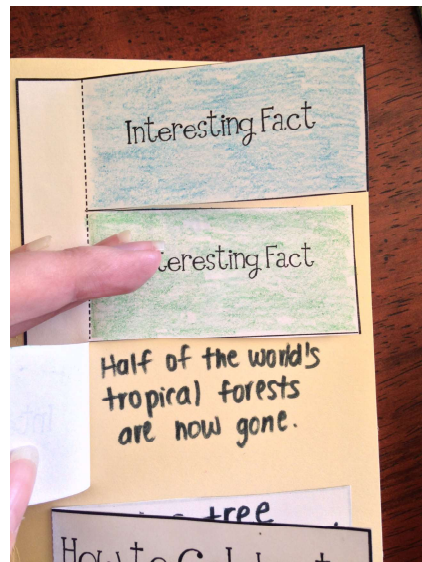


INTERESTING FACTS



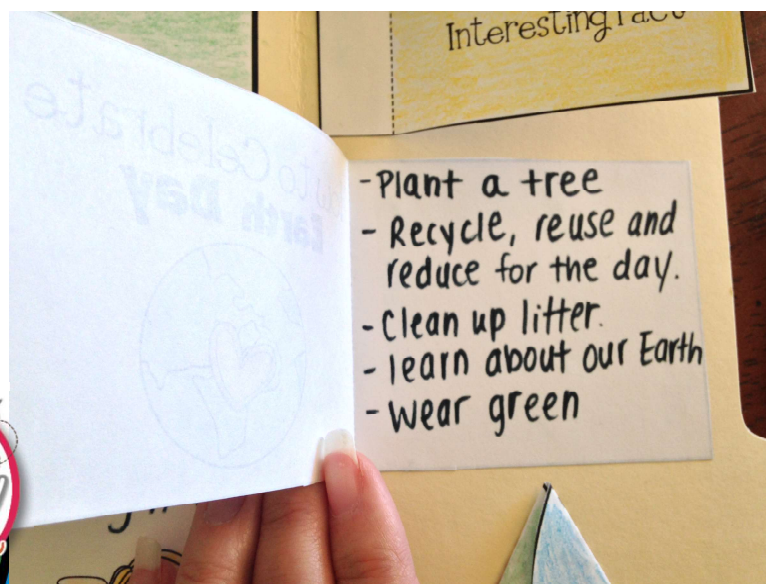
Every year in the U.S. 200 billion drink containers are sold and only one-third are recycled.

Half of the world's tropical forests are gone.



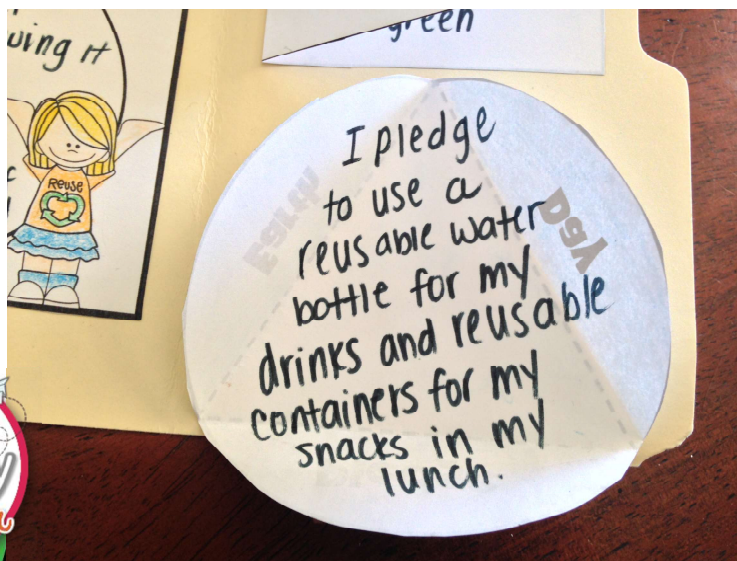
CELEBRATING EARTH DAY



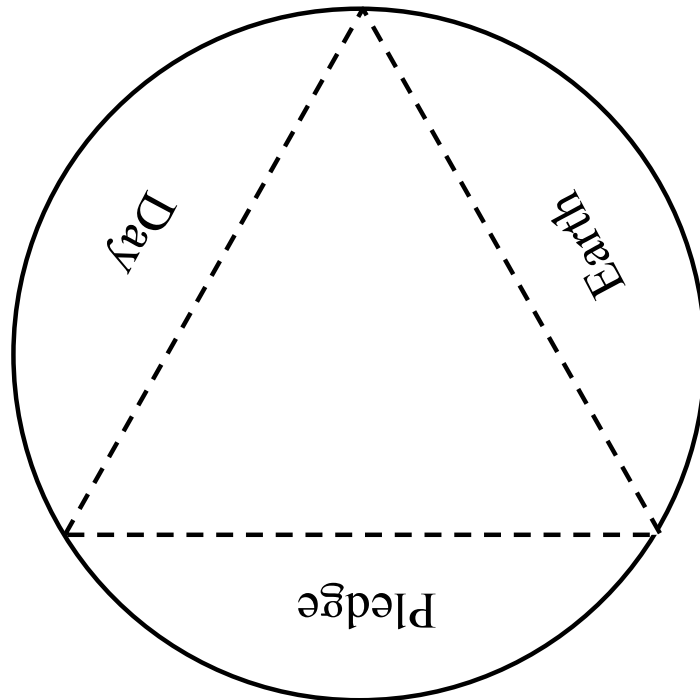

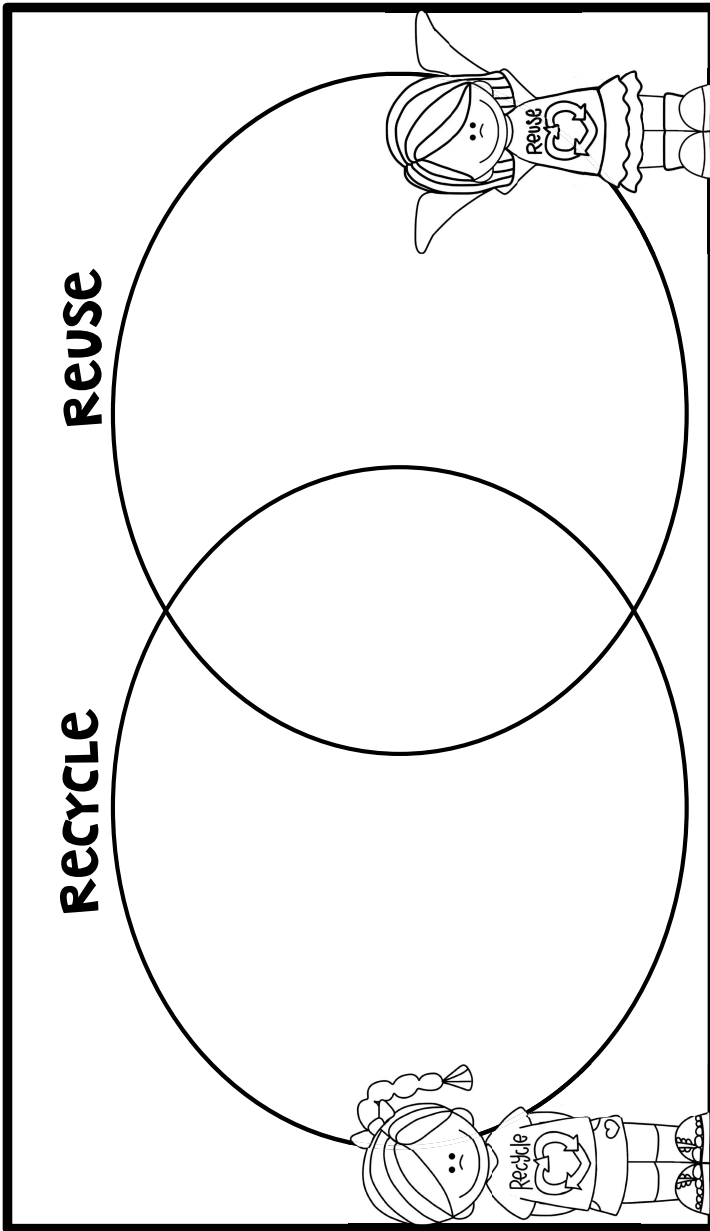
